

Défilé de mode (vidéo)

Assignment: You're a famous designer putting on a fashion show of your new designs during Fashion Week in Paris.

Purpose: To describe and inform

Writer's Role: Designer

Audience: Fashion Show Audience

Form: Video



Focus Correction Areas (FCA's):

- 1) Detailed narrative of what each of your models is wearing (each person must narrate **three** outfits), including **clothes**, **footwear**, and **accessories**. Make sure to describe the **color(s)** for each item (describing **fabric(s)** and **patterns** is a way to elaborate your narration). Include a commentary about each outfit. Be descriptive (remember - you're trying to sell your designs!)
- 2) Correct language usage (clothes, colors, fabrics, patterns) and descriptions used correctly and pronounced correctly.
- 3) Quality of video: sound (your voice) can be heard easily over the music (music does not drown you out), scene changes are not choppy (ie: your words are not cut off at the beginning or end of a sentence), spoken narrative flows and does not sound canned, scripted or monotone.!

Procedure:

1. **Type 1:** What will your models be wearing (clothing & accessories, colors, fabrics, patterns).
2. **Draft:** Using your Type 1 as a guide, write a detailed, persuasive description of the outfits each of your models is wearing. Include clothing, footwear, and accessories, and do not forget to mention colors (fabrics and patterns are optional to elaborate your narration). Also, include a commentary about each outfit.
3. **Rough Draft due** Friday, Oct. 25 (Thursday if you want to film this weekend)
4. **Read-aloud:** Students read their drafts aloud to each other, making check marks or physical corrections where necessary.
5. **Final video** must be uploaded to Google Classroom (see directions on back) by Thursday, Nov. 7.

Notes:

Colors, fabrics and patterns go after the clothes. Colors agree in gender & number with the clothes (unless followed by foncé or clair), but fabrics and patterns do not, except for écossais (plaid). Remember that orange and marron never change gender or number.

Exemples:

Une robe blanche en soie

Des chaussures noires à carreaux en cuir

Un anorak **marron** en **laine écossais**

Uploading your Video to Google Classroom (with Google Classroom app)

1. When you are in your video, click on “share” or “upload”
2. Select the Google Classroom icon
3. Click on our French class
4. Click on the Défilé de Mode Video assignment.
5. Select “Upload”
6. After it uploads the file, click “Turn In” (or “Submit”)

Uploading your Video to Google Classroom (without Google Classroom app)

1. Upload/Save your video into your school Google Drive
2. Go to our French 2 class in Google Classroom
3. Click on our French class
4. Click on the Défilé de Mode Video assignment.
5. On the next screen, click “Add”, then select “Google Drive”
6. Select your video file from your Google Drive and click “Add”
7. After it loads the file, click “Turn In”
